Henry Hardy Ongley, 71 years old, of 297 Vanderbilt ave., died suddenly late Tuesday afternoon at the Cumberland Street Hospital, Brooklyn, as the result of injuries sustained earlier in the day when he was run down by a delivery truck and dragged a number of feet.

Mr. Ongley was born in Northamptonshire, England, and was descended from the Ongleys of Canterbury, England. After attending Henley he went East to complete his education and was for many years connected with the British Consular Service, serving as consul in various parts of the East, especially, at Teheran, Persia. On his return to England he became well known as a yachtsman and turf man.

He came to this country 41 years ago and in 1887 married Rosa Rondel, teacher and sculptress, in New York City, who died in 1910. Mr Ongley was connected with the Department of Finance, of the Municipal Civil Service. He is survived by two daughters, Lucy Evelyn Ongley and Helen S Richards.

Funeral services will be held at the Lefferts Place Chapel, 86 Lefferts pl., tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock.
